Overview

The Arizona Local Technical Assistance Program's Road Scholar Program provides multiple levels of training on maintaining local streets and roads. The program provides an opportunity for municipal employees to be trained by LTAP in the latest technologies and innovations through a series of training sessions conducted at convenient locations throughout Arizona. This training program is an invaluable resource providing quality training at a price that

is affordable to counties and municipalities. Excluding the \$20 certification fee for First Aid/CPR/AED, all Road Scholar courses are free for member local governments.

The Arizona LTAP invites county and municipal road and bridge maintenance personnel, supervisors, directors, and engineers to expand their knowledge and improve their skills by taking part in this unique training program. All of the courses listed are available to anyone who wishes to take them, however to receive credit in the Road Scholar Program the student must be enrolled in the program. Students may enroll at anytime before or after taking any course.

To enroll in the Road Scholar Program, students must submit an enrollment form and all designated workshops must be completed within a four year period. Road Scholar applications and enrollment request forms may be submitted via e-mail to ttraining@azdot.gov or faxed to 602-712-3007.

In order to receive credit for any of the AZ LTAP Center's training sessions you must sign in and be present during the entire class as well as pass the final test with an 80% or higher.







Road Scholar I aimed at entry-level transportation employees, those with no or limited experience, (up to 5 years in the transportation field.)

- CPR/ First Aid/AED (8 hours)
- Signing and Striping (8 Hours)
- Maintenance Math (8 Hours)
- Two Way Radio/ Communications (8 hours)
- Construction/ Maintenance Safety (8 hours)
 - A. Trenching and Shoring
 - B. PPE (Personal Protective Equipment)
 - C. Lockout Tag-out
 - D. Hand Tool machine Safety
